

- Accepted Items: Leaves, grass, and other easily raked material will be collected. Branches and small brush must be less than 3-inches in diameter and cut into 4-foot lengths, bundled and tied for collection. (Larger branches should be cut and disposed of through a private contractor).
- How to Prépare for Collection: Place items in paper yard bags (available for purchase at grocery & home improvement stores) or loose in open barrels placed at the curb on your regular recycling day.
- Items/Materials Not Accepted: No plastic bags. Do not mix yard waste and household items. Do not place dirt inside the collection bags or open barrels.
- Capacity: There is a weight limit of 50 (fifty) pounds for each bag/barrel of yard waste.

As an informational resource to residents, the Town of Dedham has released the first issue in an updated financial newsletter series dedicated to providing background and context for local budget processes. The first issue, now available on the Town of <u>Dedham website</u>, and was prepared through the collaborative efforts of the Town Manager, Finance Director, Public Information Officer, and former Select Board member Mike Butler.

"Mike had taken the lead on past issues of the Town Financial Newsletter in 2017 and 2019 that helped to facilitate great dialog between elected officials, Town staff, and residents about municipal finances," said Town Manager Leon Goodwin. "We wanted to take his examples as inspiration and broaden the educational aspect as we work through the current budget season, leading up to Spring Town Meeting in May."

The newsletter series will be released on a weekly basis, and has been structured to provide definitions of financial terms, information about the budget development process, who is involved, sources of revenue and expenditures, tax rates and how they are set, how Dedham compares to surrounding communities, and the series also includes an issue that takes a closer look at the Robin Reyes Fund.

POLICE DEPARTMENT LAUNCHES COMMUNITY SURVEY RE: POLICE SERVICES



The Dedham Police Department is conducting a community survey related to police services. This survey is being conducted in order to gain community insight related to customer service, crime-related perceptions, community concerns, and police services. Responses to this survey will be anonymous.

Previous surveys from the Police Department were conducted in 2013, 2016, and 2019. Results from these surveys provided valuable information to the Dedham Police Department and created a baseline for future surveys.

All residents, business owners, and visitors to Dedham are invited to complete this survey. It is important for the Police Department to obtain input from the community which we serve.

The survey should take approximately 15-20 minutes to complete.

By completing this survey, you will provide the Police Department with information that can be used to guide future programs and activities of the Police Department. Further, information related to individual neighborhood concerns can be identified so that the proper resources may be dedicated to the proper areas of Town. The results of this survey can be used as a catalyst for continued improvement. The survey will be open for input by members of the community until **April 30, 2022**.

PUBLIC SAFETY BUILDING UPDATES

What to expect April 18, 2022 (Monday) through April 22, 2022 (Friday):

The project site remains closed to the public.

- Crews will be installing the footings for new traffic signals this week and **Bryant Street will be** closed to vehicular traffic from Tuesday, April 19, 2022 through Thursday, April 21, 2022 between 7:00 AM and 3:30 PM.
- Crews will continue the mechanical, electrical, fire protection system, and plumbing installations this week.

Piping throughout the entire building will continue to be insulated this week.

Installation of the exterior stone (Shouldice) will continue along the south side of the building.

Crews will continue to install the brick veneer along the northwest corner and south side of the building and will continue to build the staging along the north side of the building. The anticipated delivery date of the elevator is the third week of April.

A date has not yet been set for placement of the generator pad and transformer pad. The project team will provide updates when available.

Installation of the base and foundation for the cell tower is underway and will continue this week.

Final permit to complete this work is pending.

- Expect periodic entrance and exit of large trucks at the project site entrance, located at the intersection of Washington Street and Bryant Street. Please expect minor traffic delays at this
- No additional traffic impacts (other than listed above) or pedestrian impacts are anticipated during this week.
