Weekly Project Updates and
7-Day Look-Ahead

**Here is a look-ahead at the construction work planned for the Public Safety Building,
from July 4, 2022 to July 8, 2022**

Project Overview:

Construction of a combined public safety building commenced in December 2020 on the site of the former Town Hall at 26 Bryant Street. The new building will house the staff and equipment of Fire, Police, and Dispatch departments. The new combined Public Safety Building will replace two older Town buildings: Police Station at 600 High Street (built in 1962) and the Fire Station at 436 Washington Street (built in 1930). The new building is scheduled to open in the Fall of 2022.

What to expect July 4, 2022 (Monday) through July 8, 2022 (Friday):

- The project site remains closed to the public.
- Electrical contractors will be working onsite tomorrow, **Saturday, July 2, from 8:00 AM to 4:00 PM**. No impacts to vehicular or pedestrian travel are anticipated.
- **No crews will be working on Monday, July 4, in observance of Independence Day.**
- The new cell tower was installed on Wednesday, June 29th (see photo below).
- Elevator and elevator machine room installation will continue this week. continuing. As of Friday, July 1, masons completed the installation of concrete mason unit walls at the doors to the elevator.
- HVAC contractors will continue installing piping and valves at the induction units and will continue insulating the piping within the basement.
- Sprinkler heads on the fire suppression system within the second floor of the Fire Station will be installed this week.
- Painters will continue to paint and prime the walls within the server room and elevator machine room.
- Additional acoustic ceiling tiles will be installed on the second floor of the Police Station and cuts will be made to the ceiling tiles on the second floor of the fire station to accommodate for overhead utilities.
- The concrete foundation walls have been placed for the sallyport entrance. Crews will begin to backfill the walls and the ramp this week.
- Millwork placement and installation will begin next week.
- Expect periodic entrance and exit of large trucks at the project site entrance, located at the intersection of Washington Street and Bryant Street. **Please expect minor traffic delays at this intersection.**
- No additional traffic impacts or pedestrian impacts are anticipated during this week.

Public Viewing Area:

If you want to stop by to check out the progress, stand by the picnic table outside the north entrance to Town Hall. This spot provides a great view into the project site and is outside of the project boundaries. Worth a visit!

Construction Hours:

- Crews will be onsite:
 - **Saturday, July 2, 2022: 8:00 AM to 4:00 PM**
 - Tuesday through Friday: 7:00 AM to 5:00 PM
 - Note: The site will be closed on Monday, July 4th in observance of Independence Day.
